Enrollment Process

2011-2012 School Year

Open enrollment for the 2011-2012 school year will begin on March 10, 2011. To enroll students in Pre-K through twelfth grade, please provide the following:

1. One completed Lincoln Christian School Application for Admission (including Statement of Faith, Honor Code, and Parent/Guardian Information Forms) per student.
2. A copy of the student's most recent report card or transcript.
3. A copy of the student's most recent standardized test scores.
4. A copy of any special testing reports (physical and/or psychiatric).
5. A copy of the student's birth certificate.
6. A copy of the student's most current immunization records.
7. A recent photograph.
8. A non-refundable application processing fee of \$25.00, payable one time per family.

Next, deliver one pastoral, one teacher, and two personal recommendation forms to the appropriate individuals with stamped envelopes addressed to the LCS Service Center. The pastoral form may be filled out by the children's pastor or youth pastor of the class the applicant regularly attends. These forms should be returned directly to the LCS Service Center. The school address is printed on each recommendation form. Forms may also be faxed to (918) 234-8152.

When the applicant's file has been completed and evaluated, you will be contacted regarding your family interview. Please address any questions regarding the admissions process to the LCS Service Center by calling (918) 234-8150.

Fee Schedule

Upon receiving a written confirmation of acceptance from the LCS Service Center, a non-refundable enrollment fee of \$150.00 per student is due to secure your child's place at Lincoln. When the enrollment fee has been paid and all required enrollment forms are complete, a space will be reserved for your student. Initially, acceptance is given on a provisional basis, and is made final after each family has attended a Partners In Education (PIE) meeting, completed the PIE Agreement Form, and the final records from the student's former school have been received and reviewed.

Tuition

Tuition fees are payable directly to Lincoln Christian School either in full by August 1st or by monthly payments over a ten-month period beginning August 1st through May 1st. Families that select the payment-in-full option will receive a \$75.00 per student discount on their tuition. In order to qualify for this discount, payment must be received by August 1st. An official payment schedule and contract will be sent to parents this summer.

†The tuition for a kindergarten “First Student” is \$4160 without the facilities fee and \$5160 with the facilities fee; if multiple students are enrolled, the kindergarten student’s tuition rate will be the appropriate multiple-student elementary rate (“Second – Fourth Student”). The tuition for a Pre-K 5-day student will only receive a multiple-student discount if they qualify as a “Fourth Student.” There are no discounts for Pre-K 2-day or 3-day students.

* The facilities fee is waived for the parents or guardians of an LCS student who consistently attend scheduled worship services at Church on the Move and have contributed at least the tithe (10%) of their income to COTM on a regular basis (e.g., weekly, bi-weekly, monthly). Based on a full year, records are verified twice a year in June and December and may affect enrollment status. Families new to COTM must have at least six consecutive months of giving history. New COTM families who qualify for the waiver of the facilities fee will be accepted on probation and re-evaluated in December.

The Facts

School History

Lincoln Christian School (LCS) was founded by Pastor Willie George in 1997. The school began in the educational wing of the church with 68 students in K4 through 5th grade, and it quickly grew to accommodate kindergarten through 12th grade. In 2003, LCS saw the graduation of its first senior class, and its current enrollment is over 750 students.

Accreditation

Lincoln Christian School is fully accredited with the International Christian Accrediting Association (ICAA) and the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement (NCA CASI). The ICAA is recognized by the State of Oklahoma and approved for full membership in the National Council for Private School Accreditation (NCPSA), a national consortium for the recognition of qualifying private school accrediting associations in the United States. The ICAA is also an active member of the Oklahoma Private School Accreditation Council (OPSAC). Lincoln Christian School is a member in good standing with the Oral Roberts University Educational Fellowship (ORUEF). The NCA CASI is an organization that accredits over 8,500 public and private schools for 19 states in the central United States. LCS is also a member of the Oklahoma Secondary School Activities Association (OSSAA).

Vision

Lincoln Christian School's philosophy is stated in three priorities: godly character, academic excellence, and extracurricular activity. Our main focus is to help students discover God's gifting and plan for their lives. The faculty and families of LCS work diligently to enable students in the development of their God-given talents and to prepare them for a lifetime of learning, serving and honoring God. We firmly believe that only through the discovery of one's vision can an individual find true meaning (Proverbs 29:18). The LCS vision embraces the responsibility of providing students with an education that will give them an equitable academic opportunity with peers beyond our doors.

Faculty

Lincoln Christian School requires teachers to hold degrees, certification, and extensive experience in their areas of expertise. It is our goal to have the best teachers possible. Presently, the LCS teaching staff has an average of 9 years of experience.

Facilities

Our classrooms are exceptional in design, and we offer special facilities for art, music, and science and computer labs. There are separate auditoriums, gymnasiums, and libraries for the elementary and secondary levels. We have plenty of outside playground space for recess and activities, and our football and baseball stadiums are among the best in the state of Oklahoma.

School Colors & Mascot

The colors of Lincoln Christian School are crimson, gold, and black, each holding a special significance. Crimson is the color of sacrifice and Christ's redemptive blood, and it denotes the school's basis in the Christian faith. Gold represents character, and at LCS we place godly character at the top of our priorities. Black is the color of moral absolutes, and it reminds us to not compromise our faith or standards. As the school's mascot, the bulldog symbolizes character traits that we value – perseverance and tenacity.

Admission FAQs

Grade Levels, Class Sizes and School Hours

What grade levels are offered at Lincoln Christian School?

Lincoln Christian School offers a Pre-K through 12th grade program. Pre-K is our preschool program and classes are located in the elementary school building. Kindergarten through 5th grade classes are part of our elementary school and our middle school (6th – 8th grade) and high school (9th – 12th grade) are both located in our secondary classroom building.

What is your student-to-teacher ratio?

Smaller class sizes allow teachers to more effectively communicate with and instruct their students. For this reason, we endeavor to maintain the following student to teacher ratios:

Pre-K - Kindergarten	16:1
1 st – 2 nd grade	17:1
3 rd – 5 th grade	19:1
6 th – 12 th grade	16.9:1

What is the length of the school day and how are the classes structured?

Classes are held five days a week for two eighteen-week semesters. Middle School and High School days are composed of seven 45-minute periods. LCS employs traditional scheduling, not block scheduling. Our kindergarten program is a full-day program. Our Pre-K students may come to class from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., but actual instruction will only take place between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. so that parents who wish for their child to have a shortened day may do so.

Who will be my child's teacher?

Families of enrolled students are notified about placement at the annual "Meet Your Teacher / Schedule Pick-Up" day prior to the first day of school.

Admission Requirements

How old does a student need to be to enter kindergarten or 1st grade?

Pre-K	4 years old on or before September 1 st
Kindergarten	5 years old on or before September 1 st
1 st Grade	6 years old on or before September 1 st

What are the requirements for entrance to LCS?

- Completed application and recommendation forms
- Placement testing for 1st – 12th grade (for those applicants without recent testing scores submitted from another school)
- Completion of an approved kindergarten program or be found to be developmentally ready for 1st grade
- Entrance testing/screening for Pre-K and kindergarten students
- Successfully potty trained for Pre-K students
- Consistent family attendance and participation at primarily COTM or a similar Bible-believing church
- Family interview with the LCS School Board
- Payment of the enrollment fee upon acceptance

Do you have admissions testing?

Testing scores are just one of the items we evaluate as part of our application process to assist us in determining grade placement. We will test students that do not have recent standardized testing scores available. We also do a screening for Pre-K and kindergarten applicants to verify that they are developmentally ready to begin a full-day program.

When is your open enrollment period?

Open enrollment for the 2011-12 school year will begin on Thursday, March 10, 2011.

Do you accept late enrollments or semester transfers?

The majority of our enrollment is conducted between March and July for the start of the fall semester as this allows us to adequately plan for the upcoming school year. Whenever we do receive an admissions application after the open enrollment period has ended, it will be considered on a case-by-case basis. However, the monthly tuition payment plan option is not available for late enrollments; tuition must be paid in full up front upon acceptance.

Are students whose families attend a church other than Church on the Move admitted to LCS?

Preference is given to COTM families. However, when openings occur, we do grant interviews to consider extending admission to those who are in agreement with our philosophies.

We attended COTM at one time, but now attend another church. Does this impact our enrollment?

We will not admit students whose families have left Church on the Move. COTM is the driving force behind LCS and the reason for its existence. We believe this policy gives us the unity necessary to maintain a cohesive body, since the leadership is the same for both organizations.

Tuition

Why is there an additional facilities charge for some families?

The Lincoln Christian School facilities have been made available through Church on the Move. COTM families have helped to make these facilities possible through their obedience to God's Word as it relates to tithing and giving (Malachi 3:10-12). The additional fee helps to cover our facility expenses.

Who qualifies for the waiver of the facilities fee?

The facilities fee is waived for the parents or guardians of an LCS student who consistently attend scheduled worship services at Church on the Move and have contributed at least the tithe (10%) of their income to COTM on a regular basis (e.g., weekly, bi-weekly, monthly). Based on a full year, records are verified twice a year in June and December and may affect enrollment status. Families new to COTM must have at least six consecutive months of giving history. New COTM families that qualify for the waiver of the facilities fee will be accepted on probation and re-evaluated in December.

Are scholarships or financial aid available?

We require that parents count the cost and make the best financial choices for their family while focusing on God as their Source and Provider. We endeavor to keep our tuition rates affordable. While LCS does not have a true scholarship program, a limited amount of financial assistance may be available to families that have a demonstrated need. All financial assistance is determined by the following Financial Assistance Review Process:

- 1) The family must be members or regular attendees of Church on the Move.
- 2) The family must qualify to receive the waiver of the facilities fee by contributing at least the tithe (10%) of their income to COTM on a regular basis (e.g., weekly, bi-weekly, monthly). The LCS School Board audits records twice a year, in June and December based on a full year.
- 3) The family must be a current LCS family. New applicants to LCS will not qualify.
- 4) The family's income level will be verified by a third party analyst.
- 5) The application deadline for the 2010-2011 school year will be May 16, 2011.

Academics

Do you have honors and advanced placement classes?

Our goal at LCS is to train and develop children spiritually, academically, socially, and physically, with the express aim of preparing each child to fulfill the God-given plan for his or her life. For those students who desire to attend college, we offer Pre-AP Biology and Pre-AP Chemistry and the following AP courses: Chemistry, U.S. History, English, Spanish, and Calculus.

What classes are available to high school students in the core subject areas?

High school core classes include Bible, English I – IV, Physical Science, Biology, Chemistry, Anatomy, Physics, Algebra I & II, Geometry, Trigonometry, Calculus, Oklahoma History, Government, World History, and U.S. History.

What elective classes are available to high school students?

High school elective courses include Accounting, Art, Athletics, Computer Technology I & II, Drama, Driver's Education, Economics, Health, Jazz Band, Life, Skills, Physical Education, Spanish I - III, Vocal Music, Web Journalism, and Yearbook.

What elective classes are available to middle school students?

Middle school students have an Explore elective class built into their daily class schedule. In this Explore class, they will rotate through Art, Computer Technology, Music, and Spanish classes during the academic year, each for a period of nine weeks.

What specials classes are available to elementary students?

At the elementary level, we offer Art, Computer, Music, Physical Education, and Spanish. Art, Computer, and Spanish are taken on a rotating basis – each for a period of three weeks each nine-week quarter. Music and Physical Education classes alternate each day.

What special classes are available to kindergarten students?

Kindergarten students have P.E. and Music every other day. Spanish, Art, and Library are taken on a rotating basis (one per day).

What special classes are available to Pre-K students?

Students in Pre-K have Recess/P.E. time each morning and afternoon. Music, Spanish, Art and Library are taken on a rotating basis (one per day).

What curriculum is used at LCS?

In order to meet the educational needs of each student, Lincoln Christian School is dedicated to using the finest curricula available. As a private school, we endeavor to utilize textbooks written from a Christian perspective when possible.

Current curriculum used at the elementary level includes:

- Language Arts, Reading, and Phonics – *Houghton Mifflin*
- Math – *Saxon*
- Social Studies – *A Beka and "Time for Kids"*
- Science – *A Beka and Carolina Biological Science Kits*
- Bible – *Faith Roots*

Publishers at the secondary level include:

- Science – *Glencoe, Bob Jones Press, Prentice Hall, Addison-Wesley, McGraw-Hill, and CPO Science*
- Bible – *Faith Roots, Harrison House, Baker, Tyndale, Levitt, Ramsey, McDowell, Strobel, and Missler*
- Spanish – *Glencoe, McGraw-Hill, Houghton Mifflin, Wayside, and EMC*

Does LCS offer a home-school program?

No, but we accept home-schooled students who wish to embrace a traditional Christian classroom environment. We use academic records and rely on placement tests for verification of academic ability.

Do you offer special education classes or handicapped services?

Our school offers a traditional classroom setting with some additional help available for students who are able to be educated in a regular classroom. LCS does not have separate special education classes. All of our facilities and classrooms are handicap accessible.

What about school supply lists?

We post this information on our school website at www.lincolnchristianschool.com under the Parent Page tab.

Extracurricular Activities

Are you a member of the Oklahoma Secondary School Activities Association (OSSAA)?

LCS became an OSSAA member school effective at the beginning of the 2007-2008 school year.

Will my child be eligible for athletic competition if he/she transfers to LCS?

According to OSSAA rules, transfer students are ineligible for varsity competition for a period of 365 days after transferring to a new school. During that time, students are eligible to compete at the junior varsity level. Only students that live in our school district would be immediately eligible for varsity level competition.

What are the boundaries of your school district?

Lincoln Christian School has a small geographic district with the following boundaries: from Pine Street, south on 129th E. Avenue to 51st Street, east to 193rd E. Avenue, north to 41st Street, west to 145th E. Avenue, north to Pine Street, west to 129th E. Avenue.

What team sports do you have available?

As in all other areas, Lincoln Christian School endeavors to compete at the highest levels. Secondary sports offered are football, basketball, baseball, track, fast-pitch softball, volleyball, and cheerleading. Golf is also available at the high school level. Elementary sports include football, basketball, baseball, softball, and cheerleading.

What non-athletic activities do you offer?

Each student is encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities, and we offer a variety of options in order to appeal to different interests. Activities include National Honor Society, Presidential Physical Fitness, Quiz Bowl, Safety Patrol, Spiritual Emphasis Week, Spirit Week, High School Dances, Junior/Senior Prom, Homecoming, pep rallies, student government, spelling bees, educational field trips, Elementary Honor Choir, art shows, music competitions, and musical and drama productions.

Biblical Instruction

What are the beliefs of Church on the Move and Lincoln Christian School?

Church on the Move is a non-denominational, charismatic church. Our Statement of Faith details our beliefs and the basis for what we teach in our Bible classes and chapel services.

How often do you have Bible classes and chapel services?

All elementary and secondary students have daily Bible classes. We also incorporate Biblical truths into every subject. All students participate in chapel services twice a month.

Will my child fit in if we don't attend your church and youth group?

Although a large majority of our students are from COTM families, we do have a number of families from outside our church that have blended very well with our school culture. We always plan for new students at our school on an annual basis and they historically have acclimated to the new environment and quickly made new friends.

Dress Code

Do your students wear uniforms?

Lincoln Christian School employs school uniforms in their dress code guidelines. The primary purpose of uniforms is to give parents and students general guidelines for appropriate school clothing and appearance. More uniform information will be made available to the parents of students that are accepted for admission to LCS.

Before & After School Care (BASC)

Do you provide before-school and after-school care?

Yes, before-school and after-school care is available to LCS families. Breakfast is not served during before-school care; children should be fed before arriving at school. A light snack will be served during the after-school care program.

An annual registration fee of \$25.00 per family will be required for the use of before-school and after-school care. The registration fee covers both services. Even if only before-school or after-school care is needed, the \$25.00 registration fee applies. The fee will be charged once a non-registered student has attended before-school and/or after-school care twice within 30 days.

What are the hours and costs for before-school and after-school care?

Before School Care Monday – Friday, 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 a.m.
All students arriving before 7:30 a.m. will be placed in before-school care and charged accordingly.

One Child - \$3.00 per day, Siblings - \$2.00 per day

After School Care Monday – Friday, 3:15 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.
All students in Pre-K through 5th grade, who are on school property after 3:15 p.m. and not under direct supervision by a staff member, will be placed in after-school care. All students in grades 6th through 12th, who are on school property after 3:20 p.m. and not under direct supervision by a staff member, will be placed in after-school care.

Short-Term (Until 4:00 p.m.) One Child - \$3.00 per day, Siblings - \$2.00 per day

Long-Term (Until 6:00 p.m.) One Child - \$6.00 per day, Siblings - \$4.00 per day

What is the frequency for Before & After School Care billing?

Charges for BASC are posted on a weekly basis for charges incurred in the previous week. Statements are sent to parents via email twice a month. Payments are due at the time the email is received.

Lunch Program

Do you provide a hot lunch program?

Lunches are catered in Monday through Friday for both elementary and secondary students. (Hot lunches will not be served for Pre-K students. They will need to bring their lunch daily.)

How much do hot lunches cost?

Lunches are available for \$4.50 per day for secondary students and \$4.00 per day for elementary students. We reserve the right to increase the lunch prices as needed, but ample notice will be given.

Transportation

Does LCS provide transportation or busing?

No, LCS relies on parents and families to get students to and from school each day. If you need assistance, we suggest that you register for our car pool list, which is available in the elementary school office.

Are car pools organized?

Yes, at the beginning of the school year, LCS provides names of families who have registered and reside in the same zip code.

Discipline

What is your discipline policy?

Discipline and learning go hand in hand to build character and to allow students to develop their God-given abilities; therefore, the school uses such disciplinary measures as instruction, exhortation, correction, rebuke, and corporal punishment (paddling) in an effort to achieve the ultimate goal of self-discipline. When corporal punishment becomes necessary, the child's parents will be notified in advance.

What are the general school rules for discipline?

- Follow directions promptly and with a good attitude.
- Walk quietly to and from assigned areas.
- Keep hands, feet, and personal objects to yourself.
- Come to class prepared and complete all work assigned.
- Use appropriate language. Disrespectful speech and unkind words are not permitted.

Parental Involvement

How can parents get involved at LCS?

After an application and a required background check have been approved, parents can be involved as athletic event volunteers, teacher helpers, lunchroom or recess monitors, field trip assistants, and helpers at teacher-directed parties.

What fundraising will I have to do for school activities?

Some of our extracurricular groups have opportunities to raise money for athletic camps and for other activities such as the senior trip; however, we keep a close watch on the number of fundraisers allowed. Our school is primarily funded by tuition/fee payments.

RenWeb

How can a parent keep up with their child's assignments and grades on a regular basis?

LCS partners with RenWeb, an online-based software provider that gives you access to your child's lesson plans, assignments, and grades.

What other information can I view on RenWeb?

In addition to classroom information, you can also view student accounts, attendance, discipline, and family demographic information.

LCS Service Center

Where is the LCS Service Center located?

The LCS Service Center is located in the Willie George Ministries Building, which is on the west side of our campus at 1003 N. 129th E. Avenue in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

What are the hours of operation for the LCS Service Center?

Hours of operation are Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. with the exception of holidays. The LCS Service Center handles admissions inquiries, tuition and fee payments, and all questions regarding school accounts should be forwarded to this office. For your convenience, tuition payment boxes are located in the school offices as well as in the Willie George Ministries Building and the Church on the Move lobby.

Is anyone in the office(s) during the summer?

The LCS Service Center is staffed year-round, except for a break at Christmas.

Visiting Lincoln Christian School

Do you have open houses for prospective families?

Yes, families may attend an Open House of our elementary and secondary facilities on Sunday, February 27th from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and on Saturday, March 26th from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

Can I take a tour of your school?

Tours can be scheduled by calling the LCS Service Center at (918) 234-8150. Please call to schedule tours at least 24 hours in advance.

Do you offer shadowing of students?

Shadowing is offered on select dates and can be scheduled by turning in a request form at least two weeks in advance of the requested date. The dates available are March 21, 2011 through May 6, 2011. Please contact the LCS Service Center at (918) 234-8150 for more information.
